Sardana received a BA in Linguistics/Philology from the Sakha State University, Mirny, Russian Federation, an MA in Africana Studies from the SUNY at Albany, Albany, NY, and a PhD in Social and Comparative Analysis in Education from the University of Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh, PA. She is currently a PhD student of the Department of Anthropology, University of Manitoba. Her research interests include indigenous identities, race, ethnicity, identity politics, youth activism, anarchism, social movements, and the post-apartheid South Africa. Sardana’s dissertation will focus on the KhoiSan Revivalism movement and indigeneity claims among the coloured communities’ members in the post-apartheid South Africa.
