Dr. Peter Karari is an alumni of the Peace and Conflict Studies, University of Manitoba, where he completed his doctoral research in: “Ethno-political violence, transitional justice and peacebuilding in Kenya: Nurturing a Tripartite Hybridity.” Dr. Karari holds a Bachelor in Social Work from the University of Nairobi Kenya, a Master’s in Peace and Conflict Research from Otto-von Guericke University in Magdeburg, Germany, and a PhD in Peace and Conflict Studies from the University of Manitoba, Canada. He has diverse work experience with Non-governmental and community based organizations. He served as Country Program Manager of Drug Abuse Education Program in Kenya, Project Coordinator of Compassion International Kenya, and Chief Executive Officer of Kibera Slum Education Program, an Oxfam GB assisted project. Dr. Karari was awarded the 2010 Nahlah Ayed Prize for Student Leadership and Global Citizenship for his exceptional vision and leadership in global citizenship and contribution to civil society. He is currently working with the Immigrant and Refugee Community Organization of Manitoba (IRCOM) as the Community Resource Programs Manager.
